Pure Merriment

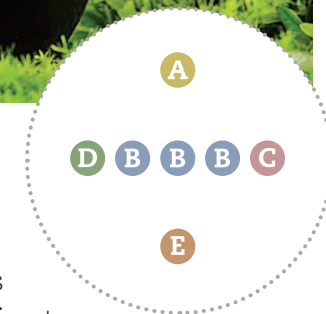
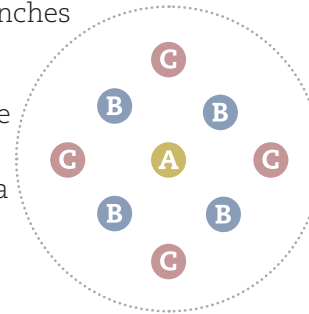
With this uplifting arrangement in your yard, you're sure to glimpse bunches of butterflies.

Boost your winged population and cut your water bill with drought-tolerant butterfly weed. This beauty's flat-topped clusters provide nectar for lots of butterflies, proving that, despite its name, it's anything but a pest.



Pentas

Pentas lanceolata
• grown as an annual

Also called star clusters, these tropical treasures are a must-have accent for butterfly gardens. Pentas come in many colors, from deep red to white, and make excellent nectar plants. Grow these flowers, which range from 8 inches to 3 feet high, in full sun.



Simple Pleasures

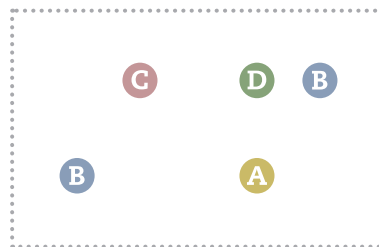
This charming basket will look fresh for the whole season thanks to the everblooming flowers it holds.

Delphinium

Delphinium • Zones 3 to 8

The queen of garden plants, as it's known, has regal spikes covered with flowers. Full-size varieties grow up to 7 feet tall, but dwarf cultivars max out at a diminutive 6 inches. Typically a summer bloomer, delphinium may flower again in the fall if cut back after the first go-round.



Cleome

Cleome hassleriana • annual

This bloom, which some call "spider flower," is a top nectar source for swallowtails. Blossoms are white, pink or purple and plants generally range from 2 to 4 feet high, though some are taller.

A simple white urn becomes truly fabulous when it's filled with rich purples and silvers, along with lavish textures.
