

Delphinium

The queen of garden plants, as it's known, has regal spikes covered with flowers. Full-size varieties grow up to 7 feet tall, but dwarf cultivars max out at a diminutive 6 inches. Typically a summer bloomer, delphinium may flower again in autumn if cut back after the first go-round.



Cleome

Cleome hassleriana • annual

This bloom, which some call "spider flower," is a top nectar source for swallowtails. Blossoms are white, pink or purple and plants generally range from 2 to 4 feet high, though some are taller.
